Kindergarten

There are so many fun ways to learn letters. letter sounds and numbers. Our kindergarten class has found several ways to do just that! We've been singing songs, reciting poems, reading stories, playing games and doing art projects. October is a fun fall month with all the colored leaves and pumpkins everywhere!!! We took a walk around the school and collected leaves to sort. We got to choose our own pumpkin that was donated to our school. In our pumpkin investigation, we used describing words, sorted, measured, compared, carved, counted seeds, labeled and learned the life cycle of the pumpkin.

Third Grade

Third Grade took two Field Lessons! One to Breckle Ridge Angus farm in Cincinnatus and one to Twin Oaks Dairy Farm in Truxton. Now students will decide which kind of farmer they would rather be and create a poster to illustrate their choice. Students must provide at least 3 reasons why and give essential information to support their decision. Our posters will be displayed in our classroom on October 31st! See you then!

First Grade

The first graders built their individual train cars using wheels, cardboard, paper, tinfoil, brads, and masking tape. Then we counted to see how many bears their car could hold. We raced our cars down a track to see which one went the farthest. We collected data and made bar graphs using the data. We also learned how to count using tally marks. Finally, we shared what we learned and what surprised us about trains.

Second Grade

This month in second grade was filled with hands-on learning! We collaborated with Ms. Jamie to collect and sort bee cocoons, recording our findings on bar charts. Our field trip to Tinker Falls and Labrador Hollow allowed us to explore waterways and aquatic life cycles, bringing science to life. Students also helped make homemade applesauce, fostering teamwork.

To wrap up our social studies unit, Ms. Maivys Diaz and her son, Nathan, shared a delicious meal celebrating their cultural heritage, featuring chicharrones, rice and beans, and flan.

It's been an exciting month, and we can't wait for more adventures!

Fourth Grade

October has been full of fun and learning! Students explored circuits, energy, and motors, while writing prompts centered on fall and Halloween. We also worked on Halloweenthemed math tasks and logic puzzles.

In ELA, we focused on 'Learning from Others' and 'Future Worlds,' and in math, we covered operations up to 1,000,000. Our new Geography unit ties in with projects in the Rural Life Lab, where we learned about the National Parks and conservation, as well as indigenous owls in New York. Students will share their projects on Expo Day! Excited for what November brings!

Fifth & Sixth Grade

In October, the 5th and 6th graders worked hard on their novel study projects for My Side of the Mountain, which tells the story of a 10-year-old boy living off the land in the Catskill Mountains, Students created models based on what they would do in the character's situation, and their projects were showcased at the school expo. They also enjoyed a field lesson at Morgan Hill State Park, where they reenacted parts of the novel by building shelters, making a supervised fire, fishing, cooking, and hiking. The students were thrilled to find newts in the pond and brought six back to the classroom to care for!



Rural Life Lab

This month students have been focusing on harvesting and putting our school garden to bed. As we continued to deliver tomatoes and cucumbers to the cafeteria, we also saved and dried seeds from flowers, fruit, and herbs to plant again in the spring. The kids have risen to the challenge of tearing out ground cover and bed borders to make way for a new garden design in the spring.

We're all looking forward to the arrival of our trout eggs in November!


